- To help children and teachers to connect to a local marae
- To support the development of Kapa Haka across the school so that children grow in understanding, pride and skill in Kapa Haka and Te Ao Maaori to be able to use around the school

Support teaching of tikanga and whakapapa of our area	 Support teachers to understand protocols to observe within a classroom

Support Kapa Haka across the school	 Support teachers in Year 3-6 with Kapa haka Provide more depth about tikanga and meanings behind waiata and actions
Support aspirations of Maaori families within the school regarding the aspects of Te Ao Maaori they would like to see, hear, feel around the school	 Take opportunities to hear the aspirations of whaanau about what children could learn within the class.
